This past year has been one of remarkable transformation and resilience for our Food Bank as we took bold steps to strengthen our organization while continuing to serve our growing community in the face of significant challenges.

A major milestone was the formal incorporation of our Food Bank as a registered Society with charitable status in Alberta. This critical step affirms our independence and sustainability, while enabling us to expand our services and enhance accountability to our donors, partners, and the community we serve.



With incorporation came the establishment of a brand-new governance structure. I am proud to be working alongside a dedicated, diverse, and capable Board of Directors. This team brings fresh energy to guide our strategic direction and ensures strong oversight as we move into the next phase of our development.

We also unveiled a new visual identity that reflects our renewed mission and values. Our updated branding includes a fresh new logo, a new domain name and the launch of a user-friendly website, helping us better connect with our supporters and reach those who need our help. These tools are essential in raising awareness and building a stronger sense of community around our mission.

While we celebrate these significant achievements, the year was not without its challenges. Donations of both food and funds were lower than expected, partly due to external factors beyond our control. A postal strike disrupted our annual fundraising campaign during a critical giving period, and ongoing economic uncertainty — including rising grocery prices, inflationary pressures, and the impact of global tariffs — made it more difficult for many to give. At the same time, the needs in our community continued to grow, driven by a rapidly increasing population and widening food insecurity.

Despite these headwinds, our team of volunteers, staff, and community partners worked tirelessly to ensure that no one in need was turned away. The spirit of compassion and collaboration remains the heart of everything we do.

Looking ahead, we remain focused on building strong community partnerships, diversifying our funding sources, and seeking new ways to address hunger in our community. We are confident that, with your continued support, we can meet the growing demand and create a more food-secure future for everyone.

HISTORY

The Cochrane Food Bank is a registered Canadian charity and incorporated as a Society in the province of Alberta. It operates under the management of the Food Bank director and the governance of the Board of Directors.

In 1995, the Cochrane Activettes began operating a food bank as one of its community service programs. What started with humble beginnings in a church basement, evolved in the purchase of a bay at the Griffin Industrial Point location in 2008 and expanded into the purchase of second bay in 2019. In August 2024 the Cochrane Food Bank Society was officially established as an independent registered charity.

The Cochrane Food Bank attributes its success to the dedication and vision of the Cochrane Activettes, who have steadfastly supported the provision of food bank services in our community. Their commitment was instrumental in shaping the Food Bank into what it is today.
